<b>AB 7</b>	<b>Huffman (D)</b>	High School Baseball Safety Act of 2010
Enacts the High School Baseball Safety Act of 2010. Expresses the findings and declarations of the Legislature regarding the safety implications of the use of nonwooden bats in high school baseball. Prohibits the use of a nonwooden baseball bat at a private or public high school competitive baseball game or practice or during a physical education class or activity conducted at a private or public high school.

<b>AB 35</b>	<b>Furutani (D)</b>	Education: Workforce Development
Declares the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to develop a strategic plan in the education system for workforce preparation and career technical education. Requires the State Postsecondary Education Commission to develop a strategic plan for connecting education and workforce development in the state. Requires the commission to cooperate with other specified state education agencies to make plan recommendations.

<b>AB 97</b>	<b>Torlakson (D)</b>	School Curriculum: Content Standards
Requires the SPI to convene an Academic Content and Performance Standards Review Panel for the reading/language arts and mathematics curriculum area content standards adopted by the state board. Requires the state board to hold hearings on the recommended changes to the standards, and adopt or reject the recommended changes. Authorize a review panel to modify the recommendations to correct deficiencies identified by the state board, resubmit changes for adoption.

<b>AB 142</b>	<b>Hayashi (D)</b>	State Lottery
Relates to the allocation of state lottery net revenues to public education, to the public in the form of prizes and for lottery expenses. Provides for a change in the percentages of such revenues allocated for those purposes. Requires the Lottery to report on the total net revenues allocated to the benefit of public education for that fiscal year and to report same on its Web site. Provides the formula to be used by the Lottery Commission when setting the percentage of net revenues to public education.

<b>AB 220</b>	<b>Brownley (D)</b>	Kindergarten-University Facilities Bond Act
Amends existing law regarding ongoing eligibility of a school district for new construction funding using specified calculations. Revises the calculation. Requires a district to certify it has entered into a binding		

contract for professional services or for construction, or both, in order to complete an approved project as a qualifying factor for a district to receive funding for a new construction school facilities project. Provides that a district board may extend the time period to meet the criteria.

<b>AB 317</b>	<b>Solorio (D)</b>	School Attendance: H1N1 (2009) Influenza Virus
Provides that pupil absences related to the H1N1 (2009) influenza virus in an public elementary or secondary school be deemed to be an epidemic for the purposes of provisions of existing law regarding the ADA of any school district, COE, or regional occupational center.

<b>AB 346</b>	<b>Torlakson (D)</b>	Joint-Use School Facilities
Authorizes the SAB to provide grants for joint-use projects on property adjacent to a schoolsite and owned by a governmental entity. Provides that the land would be leased to the school district for a specified period. Expands eligible projects to include a child health and wellness clinic, a science and technology or career technical facility, an educational science, historical or cultural center, performing arts center, or a physical education, outdoor recreation or parking site.

<b>AB 391</b>	<b>Torlakson (D)</b>	Pupil Assessment: STAR Program
Amends the California Assessment of Academic Achievement Act that provides for the development of a statewide pupil assessment program and defines various terms for that purpose. Defines additional terms for that purpose. Requires the SPI to contract for an independent evaluation of the STAR Program. Requires the Superintendent to report on the evaluation to specified entities.

<b>AB 548</b>	<b>Chesbro (D)</b>	Education Finance: CSR Program
Amends existing law that establishes the CSR Program. Provides funding options for local educational agencies for state apportionment purposes under the program. Provides program related funding options for specified school years for the Riverside USD.

<b>AB 572</b>	<b>Brownley (D)</b>	Charter Schools
Specifies that a charter school is subject to the Ralph M. Brown Act, unless it is operated by an entity governed by the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act, in which case the school would be subject to the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act. States that a charter school is subject to the Public Records Act and the Political Reform Act. Imposes governmental ethics and conflict-of-interest provisions on administrators and personnel. Authorizes a charter school teacher to serve on the school governing board.

<b>AB 677</b>	<b>Solorio (D)</b>	Public Works: Prevailing Wages
This bill would expand the definition of “Public Works” projects that are subject to general prevailing wage provisions to include all construction or maintenance of, renewable energy generation projects (regardless of public or private funding sources) performed at or near a school district or community college property where the school district or community college benefits from the purchase of the energy through long-term energy agreements (energy contracts greater than five years in length).

<b>AB 999</b>	<b>Skinner (D)</b>	Juveniles: Division of Juvenile Facilities
Relates to the Division of Juvenile Facilities. Requires the projected board date of a ward to be advanced according to completion of specified programs meant to offer a ward successful reentry into society. Requires the division to implement policies and regulations on ward disciplinary matters. Relates to the extension or postponing of a ward's projected board date and program credits.

<b>AB 1178</b>	<b>Block (D)</b>	Sales, Use and Corporation Taxes
Exempts textbooks and supplies purchased at state institutions of higher education by students from the sale and use tax. Relates to corporation tax regarding tax havens for the water's edge election. Amends the Corporation Tax Law and the waters-edge election to expand the list of affiliated entities for specified taxable years, to include a corporation that is incorporated, headquartered, or located in a country that is a tax haven.

<b>AB 1223</b>	<b>Block (D)</b>	Linked Learning
Authorizes the CTC to convene a workgroup for linked learning competence for holders of a single subject teach credential who will be teaching pupils enrolled in linked learning programs. Authorizes the commission to work with the SPI to gather and post, on an appropriate Internet Web site, best practices from school districts and schools on curriculum development and professional development relating to multiple pathway programs.

<b>AB 1229</b>	<b>Evans (D)</b>	Juvenile Court Costs
Authorizes the court to designate a court financial evaluation officer to make evaluations of liability for reimbursement for the costs of legal services rendered to a minor. Requires both the court financial evaluation officer and the county financial evaluation officer to follow the procedures set forth for county financial evaluation officers.

<b>AB 1374</b>	<b>Brownley (D)</b>	Adult Education: Teaching Credentials
Provides a teaching credential issued by the CTC will remain in force in accordance with existing laws and is exempt from new laws and rules. Provides exceptions. Recasts the adult credential for nonacademic and academic subjects. Specifies different requirements for such subjects. Recasts the minimum requirements		

for a specified adult education teaching credential. Repeals a provision of existing law that provides specified minimum requirements for such credential.

<b>AB 1643</b>	<b>Smyth (R)</b>	Alcohol Beverages: Places of Consumption
Provides that the prohibition against the sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages on the grounds of a public schoolhouse CDEs not apply if such beverages are used during events at a community college-owned facility in which any grade from kindergarten to grade 12, inclusive, is schooled, if the event is held at a time when students are not present at the facility.

<b>AB 1647</b>	<b>Hayashi (D)</b>	Athletics
Makes it unlawful for any person to hold himself or herself out as an athletic trainer unless he or she has met specified educational requirements and has been certified. Requires a school district to comply with specified requirements if it elects to offer any interscholastic athletic programs to include an automatic external defibrillator, removing a person suspected of suffering a head injury, and an emergency plan. Requires the establishment of a heat-acclimatization program and district referral.

<b>AB 1651</b>	<b>De La Torre (D)</b>	Public Employees' Retirement Law: Furloughs: Credit
Provides that the calculations for retirement allowances under the Public Employees' Retirement Law for specified local public safety members and members who are employees of specified educational and entities who are subject to mandatory furloughs shall include, as credit for service and compensation, the amount of service and compensation that would have been credited and paid had the member not been subject to mandatory furloughs on or after a specified date.

<b>AB 1665</b>	<b>Swanson (D)</b>	School Employees: Scope of Representation
Requires public school employers to give reasonable written notice to the exclusive representative of classified personnel of a public school employer's intent to make any change to matters within the scope of representation, including, but not necessarily limited to, start time. Requires public school employers to provide a recognized employee organization with the opportunity to meet and negotiate with the public school employer.

<b>AB 1683</b>	<b>Torres (D)</b>	Education: Finance Preschool
Relates to education finance for children of youth who are in custody, on probation, or are in the foster care system. Requires priority for participation in state preschool programs also to be given to children who have a biological custodial parent who is, or who has been within the previous 6 months, a dependent or ward of the juvenile court. Prohibits priority enrollment from being used to displace children who are currently receiving care.

<b>AB 1712</b>	<b>Furutani (D)</b>	School Employees: Leaves of Absence
Provides leave rights to a permanent employee in classified service with a school district who is elected to the Legislature. Requires that every person who is employed by a community college district as a permanent employee in classified service who is elected to the Legislature be granted a leave of absence by the governing board of the district.

<b>AB 1716</b>	<b>Torlakson (D)</b>	Land Use: Development Fees: Reimbursement
Requires a person subject to the increased development fee who has accepted an offer of a reimbursement election from a school district to also be reimbursed for any interest on that supplemental amount accrued during the interim time period prior to the district receiving those funds as determined by the district.

<b>AB 1724</b>	<b>Chesbro (D)</b>	Necessary Small Schools: Del Norte County Schools
This bill deems two elementary schools in the Del Norte County Unified School District (DNCUSD) necessary small schools for the purpose of receiving revenue limit (general purpose) funding. Specifically this bill: 1) Requires, commencing with the 2010-11 fiscal year (FY), DNCUSD to receive necessary small school apportionments for Gasquet Mountain elementary and Margaret Keating elementary schools. 2) Prohibits the specified elementary schools from receiving necessary small school funding if their average daily attendance (ADA) exceeds 100.

<b>AB 1741</b>	<b>Coto (D)</b>	Charter Schools
Authorizes a school district governing board to deny a petition for the establishment of a charter school in which a minimum percentage of its students will be served as English learners, if the petition CDEs not contain a reasonably comprehensive description of program requirements relating to the needs of such learners. Provides prior to renewing a charter, the entity that granted the charter, prior to renewal, consider the degree of implementation of those programs in school's academic performance.

<b>AB 1742</b>	<b>Coto (D)</b>	Education: Special Education
Amends existing law that requires a nonpublic, nonsectarian school that provides special education and related services to an individual with exceptional needs meet specified requirements. Specifies that required standards-based, core curriculum and instructional materials used to provide the special education and related services may include technology-based materials.

<b>AB 1748</b>	<b>Hill (D)</b>	Alcoholic Beverage Control: Public Schoolhouses
Amends existing law that generally prohibits the sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages at a public schoolhouse or any grounds thereof. Provides that this prohibition CDEs not apply if the alcoholic		

beverage is possessed, consumed or sold pursuant to a license, for special events held at the facilities of a public community college located in a county of the first or 4th class. Makes legislative findings and declarations as to the necessity of such special statute.

<b>AB 1775</b>	<b>Furutani (D)</b>	Public Schools: Fred Korematsu Day

Requires the Governor annually to proclaim January 30 as Fred Korematsu Day of Civil Liberties and the Constitution. Designates that date of each year as having special significance in public schools and educational institutions, and encourages those entities to observe that date by conducting exercises remembering the life of Fred Korematsu.

Prohibits a public agency, in the event that the parent or guardian of a child submits a written revocation of his or her consent at any time subsequent to the initial provision of special education and related services to the child, from continuing to provide special education and related services to the child or from using specified procedural safeguards to obtain agreement or a ruling that the services may be provided to the child. Provides the agency is not required to amend records after revocation.

Requires a school district to accept a wide range of documents and representations from a parent or guardian of a pupil as reasonable evidence that the pupil meets residency requirements. Authorizes a school district to make reasonable efforts to determine that a pupil actually meets the residency requirements, if an employee of the district reasonably believes the parent or guardian has provided false or unreliable evidence of residency.

Provides that participation of pupils in the weekend activities would not be included in the attendance reported to the CDE for the calculation of either the maximum grant amount or a supplemental grant amount.

<b>AB 1913</b>	<b>Davis (D)</b>	Retirement: Pension Fund
Requires the Board of Administration of the PERS and the Teachers' Retirement Board to report annually to the Legislature the ethnicity and gender of emerging investment managers who participate in managing its portfolio of fund management contracts. Requires the boards to develop and include in the report plans and strategies to increase participation of emerging investment managers until they manage at least 10% of the boards' actively managed portfolio.

<b>AB 1922</b>	<b>Davis (D)</b>	Civil Rights Education: State Civil Rights Education
Establishes the Civil Rights Education Commission. Authorizes the commission to study and provide advice to the SBE with respect to the inclusion of civil rights education in the history-social science framework and criteria for evaluating instructional materials. Requires the commission to study and review current framework and to advise the state board and the Curriculum Development and Supplemental Materials Commission on the inclusion of such education.

<b>AB 1933</b>	<b>Brownley (D)</b>	Foster Children: Education

Allows the child to continue at that school of origin if the court's jurisdiction is terminated prior to the end of the academic year.

<b>AB 1937</b>	<b>Fletcher (R)</b>	Pupil Health: Immunizations
Authorizes a school district to permit certain licensed health care practitioner who are acting under the

Authorizes those health care practitioners to administer immunizing agents subject to specified conditions, including notification of the school nurse, who would maintain control as necessary in accordance with his or her duties.

<b>AB 1950</b>	<b>Brownley (D)</b>	Charter School Facility Grant Program

Requires the Controller to propose, and the Education Audits Appeal Panel to adopt, a charter school supplement to the audit guide in order to provide guidance to auditors regarding which sections of the school district and county office audit guide apply to charter schools and to create specific guidance related to the unique nature of charter schools.

Prohibits charter schools operated by a private entity from employing relatives of charter school personnel. Adds additional criterion relating to the disclosure of relatives of charter school personnel.

<b>AB 1987</b>	<b>Ma (D)</b>	Public Retirement: Final Compensation: Retirees

This bill places new standards and limitations on public retirement systems in California with respect to final compensation calculations, ongoing audits and penalties for non-compliance, and prohibitions against retirees from immediately returning to work on a part time or contract basis. Specifically, the bill:

- 1) Requires each retirement system to establish accountability provisions for participating employers that include an ongoing audit process and penalty provisions for noncompliance.
- 2) Excludes cash conversions of accrued employee benefits from being included in retirement calculations.
- 3) Prohibits final settlement or termination pay from being included in retirement calculations.
- 4) Prohibits a retiree from returning to work as a retired annuitant or as a contract employee for a period of 180 days after retirement. This requirement applies to anyone retiring on and after January 1, 2011.
- 5) Limits the increases in compensation that can be used in retirement calculations by members during their final three years preceding retirement to the average increases in compensation received by similarly situated employees in the same or closely comparable group. Promotions or routine merit increases would not be affected by this provision.
- 6) Authorizes a retirement system to not include in retirement calculations any compensation they determine was paid for the principal purpose of enhancing a member's retirement benefit.
- 7) Double joins this bill with SB 1425 (Simitian)

Authorizes the SPI to establish a task force for education technology to make recommendations to increase and enhance the level of technology used to deliver instruction in public schools. Requires the task force to address specified topics to be presented to the SBE. Requires the board to adopt a statewide plan to increase and enhance that technology for schools technology literacy model content standards.

<b>AB 2027</b>	<b>Blumenfield (D)</b>	Online Education: School Attendance
Relaxes the requirements placed on school districts and county offices of education (COE) for calculating and funding average daily attendance (ADA) for pupils enrolled for at least the minimum day in classes that include both in-classroom and online classes. Specifically, this bill authorizes a school district or county office of education, commencing in the 2011-12 fiscal year, to claim one day of attendance toward average daily attendance on the basis of a pupil's attendance at a class or classes in the classroom-based setting on that day, if the pupil is enrolled in grade 9, 10, 11, or 12, and is enrolled for at least the minimum school day in classes that include both one or more courses in a classroom-based setting and one or more courses that are offered through an online program by a high school, where each online course in which the pupil is enrolled is a "high-quality" online course.

<b>AB 2034</b>	<b>Knight (R)</b>	Public School Volunteers
Amends existing law authorizes any person, except a person required to register as a sex offender pursuant to a designated provision, to be permitted by the governing board of a school district to serve as a nonteaching volunteer aide under the immediate supervision and direction of certificated personnel. Specifies that these provisions apply to charter schools. Prohibits persons who have been convicted of designated sex or controlled substance offenses from serving as nonteaching volunteer aides.

<b>AB 2048</b>	<b>Torlakson (D)</b>	School Facilities
